HIGHLIGHTS

- **1.** Médecins du Monde Greece launched its humanitarian mission at the border of Siret, Romania on **10.03.2022**.
- 2. A Mobile Medical Unit has permanently remained in Siret, supported by both medical and administrative personnel and volunteers, including a general practitioner, a gynaecologist and a paediatrician. To date, a total of 70 health volunteers have supported the operation of the Mobile Medical Unit, rotating in teams of four.
- 3. Médecins du Monde Greece provides Primary Health-care and Protection (including first aid, mental health and psychosocial support) at the Siret border, while also visiting and supporting 7 refugee shelters Romania. So far, MdM-Greece's medical field team has supported a total of more than 3,000 patients in transit. These include cases with mild symptoms (colds, flu, fainting, etc.), emergencies (trauma care) and chronic patients who need more complex treatment and medication.
- 4. Médecins du Monde Greece has so far collected around 80 tons of humanitarian material support (mainly medicines and medical supplies) and has already carried out 16 humanitarian missions in Ukraine, accompanying the delivery of items reaching 5 oblasts (Chernivtsi, Lviv, Donetsk, Odessa, Sumy)
- 5. Médecins du Monde Greece, in cooperation with the Directorate General for Development and Humanitarian Aid of the Hellenic Ministry of Foreign Affairs, supported the south-eastern region of Odessa by transporting loads of humanitarian aid (PPE, medicines and medical supplies) in early April. The next humanitarian aid targeting Odessa Oblast is being prepared and will be carried out in the upcoming weeks
- 6. MdM-Greece has been closely cooperating with local authorities in Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Lviv, as well as local partners in the scope of providing hospitals and health centres in Ukraine, with essential material aid. On 20.09.2022, MdM-Greece's representatives met with the Head of Chernivtsi Regional Council and signed a MoU.
- 7. During September, MdM-Greece representives made a field visit and needs assessment in Kuty Hromada located at the mountainous area in south-east Ivano-Frankivsk

- Oblast. MdM-Greece team held a meeting with the Mayor and paid a visit to Kuty Central Hospital as well as other Outpatience Clinics in the surrounding villages. A Medical Mobile Unit will be soon deployed in the area in order to support the local health system address the current needs of access to healthcare for locals and IDPs leaving in remote and rural areas.
- 8. In September, MdM-Greece in collaboration with the Odessa based NGO, Way Home has officially initiated its activities in Odessa city, offering PHC and MHPSS services to local vulnerable population and IDPs.
- 9. With the support of Americares and a new partnership with ACTED, in August and September, a total of 4 humanitarian aid missions were successfully delivered to Health Facilities throughout Ukraine. In particular, medicines and medical equipment and consumables were delivered to 4 hospitals in Chernivtsi Oblast (Bukovinian Center of Remedial Treatment and Integrated Rehabilitation for Children, Bukovinian Clinical Oncology Center and Chernivtsi Emergency Hospital, Khotyn Central District Hospital). In addition, specialized psychotropic medicines were delivered for the 2nd time to both Chernivtsi Regional Psychiatric Hospital and Slovyansk Psychiatric Hospital. Lastly, medical supplies and first-aid kits were sent to Bilopillya Outpatient Medical Center, Sumy Oblast for the 1st time.
- 10. More than 3,000 internationally displaced persons in Greece have received support and health services in Athens and Thessaloniki (including housing, social counselling, psychological support, liaison with the NHS and the Public Administration, and distribution of basic necessities and food aid).
- 11. So far, more than 15,000 people have been directly benefited from the intervention activities of Médecins du Monde Greece, while the indirect beneficiaries are estimated at around 500,000.

BACKGROUND

The Russian Federation's military operations in Ukraine began on 24 February 2022. In total, it is estimated that the number of people in need of humanitarian assistance has increased from 2.9 million before 24 February to 17.7 million after, with numbers expected to continue increasing because of continuing hostilities.¹


It is also estimated that 24 million people have been affected in some way in the war-torn and surrounding areas of Ukraine. The escalation of the conflict has caused an immediate and sharp increase in humanitarian needs, both internally and in neighbouring countries receiving refugees. Many remain trapped in areas of escalating conflict and, due to the disruption of services, are unable to meet their basic needs, including food, water and medicine.

During the seventh consecutive month of hostilities, these are mostly concentrated in the eastern and southern parts of Ukraine. Insurgencies have resulted in civilian casualties

and significant damage to infrastructure and buildings, particularly in the cities of Mariupol and Chernihiv. Rocket attacks were reported around the cities of Kherson, Kyiv, Mariupol and Mykolaiv, as well as in the western city of Lviv. The civilian toll from the ongoing military offensive continues to rise.

On the 3rd of October, the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) recorded **299 dead** and **923 wounded** for the month of September, a total of **15,246 civilian casualties** since 24 February.²

Regarding health, about **14.5 million people** are estimated to be in need of health and **700,000 people** of nutrition assistance in March–Decmber 2022; this figure is likely to increase as a result of continuing hostilities. Power shortages, lack of medicines and medical supplies, understaffing, damaged infrastructure, and disruptions to water systems have affected the functioning of health facilities.³


